Recycling Technician – MRF Line Worker

Western Washtenaw Recycling Authority is accepting applications for a full-time Recycle Technician – Line Worker position at our Materials Recovery Facility (MRF). An employee in this position will work on a short line to sort recyclable materials from contamination, and sort materials by type. This employee will assist in weekly sorting of recycling, general cleaning, and various other tasks assigned by the Facility Manager or MRF Supervisors. This employee should hold a valid Michigan Driver's License and have the ability to stand for long periods of time. Drug and alcohol testing is a required part of the hiring process and maintaining your position at the WWRA.

Primary Responsibilities

- Identify and remove non-recyclable material from the line
- Separate specific materials from the stream as directed by the MRF Supervisors
- Clean and maintain your work area, as well as the WWRA Facility
- Adhere to OSHA and EPA regulations and standards.
- Perform other driving and Materials Recovery Facility tasks, as assigned by your reporting managers or the Facility Manager

Qualifications and Experience

- High school diploma or GED preferred
- Michigan Driver's License required
- Must be 18 years of age or older
- 1-2 years of work experience preferred
- Must be able to stand for long periods of time
- Must be able to walk, use hands and fingers, reach, stoop, kneel, crouch, and balance
- Must be able to lift, push, pull, or carry objects up to 50 pounds
- Must pass a drug and alcohol test for both hiring and continued employment

Working Conditions

- Frequently exposed to dust, chemicals, contamination, and airborne particles
- Work within the MRF is usually loud
- Depending on the season, working conditions can be humid, dry, hot, or cold

The MRF may have working conditions that are not suitable to those with asthma, sensitivities, or similar conditions, but masks, gloves, earplugs, protective eyewear, and other PPE will be provided.
